

APA Citation Style: American Psychological Association

When using APA Citation style within the text, write the author's last name, the date in parentheses directly after the quote. This will refer the reader to the reference list at the end of the paper. In the reference list, capitalize only the first word of the title not each word in the title. **If the information regarding a title goes over one line, the following lines for that title should be indented by five spaces.** Use the Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association (call # REF BF76.7 .P83 2001) for citing other materials that are not included on this page.

BOOK

Basic Form: Author/editor. (Date of publication). *Book title* (edition). Place of publication: Publisher.

Example: Attenborough, D. (1984). *The living planet: A portrait of the earth* (2nd ed.). Boston: Little, Brown, & Co.

ARTICLES IN PRINT

Basic Form: Article authors. (Date of publication). Article title. *Periodical Title, Volume* (Issue), Page #s.

Example: Bogart, G. (1991). The use of meditation in psychotherapy. *American Journal of Psychotherapy, 45*(2), 383-412.

ARTICLES FROM ELECTRONIC DATABASES

Basic Form: Article authors. (Date of Publication). Article title. *Periodical Title, Volume* (Issue), Page Numbers. Retrieved on [date retrieved] from [Name of Database] database.

Example: Schneiderman, R.A. (1997). Librarians can make sense of the Net. *San Antonio Business Journal, 11* (31), pp. 58+. Retrieved on June 20, 2002 from Gale's InfoTrac OneFile database.

A SPECIFIC DOCUMENT ON A WEB SITE

Basic form: Author. (Date of Publication). *Web site title*. Retrieved on [the date retrieved], from [URL, Electronic address for the Webpage]

Example: Ross, D. (1999, November 19). *Electronic reference formats*. Retrieved on July 19, 2002 from <http://www.apa.org/journals/webref.html>
